Definition of Late Provincial Entry Penalty

A Provincial/Territorial Federation/Association will be charged the Late Provincial Entry Penalty if the above mentioned checklist items #1, 2, 3 and/or 4 is not fulfilled by the set deadline.

Definition of Late Individual Entry Penalty

A Provincial/Territorial Federation/Association will be charged the Late Individual Entry Penalty if a delegate is registered between the set registration deadline and the late registration deadline.

Note - No entries will be accepted after the late registration deadline unless written approval is given by the respective Program Director at GCG.

There is no Late Individual Entry Penalty for substitutions.

Refund Policy

Written request for a refund can be made to the attention of Mariève Reid until May 13th. After this date, there will be NO reimbursement of the registration fees (injuries included).

EVENT PURPOSE & ELIGIBILITY

Men's Artistic Gymnastics

Purpose

- Provide a prestigious annual competitive opportunity for developing High Performance gymnasts, showcasing top provincial talent, provide national rankings, and declare Canadian Champions for each category of competition: Open, Novice, Junior, and Senior.
- The Canadian Championships will also be used as a part of the selection process for National Team Status and Sport Canada Athlete Assistance Program Carding.

Women's Artistic Gymnatics

Purpose:

- To provide a national level competitive opportunity for developing athletes.
- Rank participants at the national level and declare champions in:
 - a. JO Level 9 (11-13) and JO Level 10 (12-15) & (16+). Team, All-Around, and Apparatus;
 - b. Novice, Junior, and Senior: All-Around and Apparatus.

- Rank athletes as part of the system to have access to:
 - a. Sport Canada Athlete Assistance Program Carding;
 - b. National Team and Espoir Status.

MAG & WAG Coaches

All registered coaches must be certified NCCP Level 3 in Artistic Gymnastics in order to coach Men's or Women's Artistic Gymnastics at Canadian Championships in any level. A one-time exemption may be requested from the Program Director – Artistic Gymnastics using the exemption request forms. A coach who is employed on a full-time basis by an organization based outside Canada is exempted from this requirement.

Trampoline Gymnastics

Purpose:

- To identify Junior and Senior athletes for the competitive year and to rank athletes as part of the system to have access to National team status and Sport Canada Athlete Assistance Program (AAP Carding-Trampoline).
- Last trial for Indo Pacific Team selection (all events)
- Second trial for National Team selection (all events)

Athletes

National level athletes in the categories listed below in trampoline (individual and synchronized), tumbling, and/or double mini trampoline who are in good standing with their provincial/territorial federation/association and GCG are eligible to register.

TRA & DMT: L5 Novice (16U), L5 Novice (17+), L6 Espoir (17U), L6 Espoir (18+) Junior (15-18), Senior (17+)

SYN: L5 Novice (11+), Senior (15+)

TUM: L5 Novice (15U), L5 Novice (16+), L6 Espoir (11+), Junior (13+), Senior (17+)

Coaches

All registered coaches must be certified NCCP Level 3 in trampoline in order to coach trampoline or double mini trampoline. Coaches registered to coach in

tumbling must be certified NCCP Level 3 in either trampoline or artistic gymnastics. A one-time exemption may be requested in writing from the Trampoline Program Director. A coach who is employed on a full-time basis by an organization based outside Canada is exempted from this requirement.

NOTE: All athletes must have met the minimum score for finals applicable to their regular competitive category in order to participate in finals.

JUDGES

MAG & WAG Judges:

All judges MUST stay at the designated judges' housing at Lister Centre to receive transportation. Housing has been designated by the organizing committee to that effect.

GCG will manage the accommodations for ALL judges. The provinces must register their judges using the registration form, as per years' past. GCG will then make reservations for all judges based on registrations received by the provinces.

Some meals will be served by the organizing committee at the competition venue for judges.

All judges need to be N1 (senior) ranked judges. Trampoline judges must be available for all sessions; that is the same judge cannot be sent for both TRA and DMT. A judge can be sent for "double-duty" only if certified in both TUM and DMT.

Provinces are responsible for sending the minimum number of judges outlined above, or finding a replacement judge to act on their behalf. The fine for not providing the required number of N1 judges is \$1000 for each missing judge.

Gymnastics Canada will provide funding for some FIG judges selected by GCG to ensure full FIG Panels for the Senior events only. The judges will be named in March.

Provinces who are not required to send any judges but who are sending athletes to Canadian Championships are encouraged to send one judge. This will ensure that the information that is being discussed at judges' meetings and on panels can be brought back to the provinces to aid in the development of the athletes and judges in their own provinces. Provinces are responsible for the travel and cost of accommodations of their judges.

Judges must stay at the **Lister Centre Residences** to receive transportation.

WAG FLOOR MUSIC

Music will NOT be collected in advance. It will be played from CDs on-site. Each Head Coach is responsible for submitting 1 CD as noted below to the Music Technician at the beginning of their floor training session.

To comply with SOCAN regulations and copyright law, the CD must be clearly labelled with the following information:

- Athlete Name
- Club, Province
- Name of Artist and Composer
- Title of the piece of music (or titles if more than one is mixed together)
- Duration

CDs will be tested during training.

EVENT TRANSPORTATION	Transportation will be provided for all teams and delegates between the Edmonton airport and the delegate's village at the University of Alberta.
	The travel information for each delegate must be complete in the registration form in order to receive transportation to and from the airport.
	The competition venue is less than 200 meters from the residences. Delegates are expected to walk once on-site.

	The City of Edmonton has a very extensive transit system that covers bus service, and LRT (Light Rail Transit) services right into the heart of the University of Alberta campus. This can be utilized by both teams and spectators for moving around to the various attractions within Edmonton, as well as from hotels.
TEAM ACCOMMODATIONS	All Championships Delegates will be housed and are required to stay on campus at the Lister Centre Residences.
	Individuals must pay a surcharge fee of \$125 and be authorized by the organizing committee and the province/territory for not staying on campus at the Lister Centre Residences or they will not be eligible to participate at the 2016 Canadian Gymnastics Championships.
	Once delegations and their numbers are finalized, housing will be assigned, and details forwarded to each PTO.
	All Delegates for the Championships will be housed at the Lister Centre. There is a combination of single bed dorm style rooms, and the majority are double beds. There is a shared common area, as well as kitchen area with multiple refrigerators available.
	All residences are smoke free and include free internet (bring your own Ethernet cable) and a telephone for local calls. Laundry facilities are located in each building.
